St Just celebrates the diverse range of native wild flowers which grow between crevices in Cornish stone hedges, footpaths and gardens creating a carpet of colour and interest as well as serving the local wildlife.

In complete contrast, and enveloping St Just is the wild landscape of the heathland made up of heathers, gorse, bracken and grasses creating one of the world's most fascinating environments evolving over many thousands of years.

St Just, as of other mining communities, used the heathland for fuel and to graze animals but today it is managed to provide a major attraction for visitors who love the ruggedness and walk the South West coastpath crossing the lower part of St Just to Tregeseal.
